### Questions to complete in your colonial profile:

2. Who was the founder of this colony? Who were the first settlers?
3. When (what year) and why was this colony established?
4. What type of economy did this colony have? What was produced there? What was grown there?

5. What religion predominated in this colony? Were a variety of religions tolerated? (i.e. was there religious freedom there)
  
6. Did the colony allow slavery? If so, what was the relative size of the slave population?
  
7. What type of interaction existed between the settlers and the Native American population?
  
8. What were some of the features of daily life in this colony?
  
9. Were there many different groups or classes of people in this colony? Explain.
  
10. What form of government (if any) did this colony have throughout its history? Did this ever change?
